


A History of Cambridge Street

Cambridge Street in our neighborhood has a long history dating back to the early 1800s, serving as an early connection to Cambridge and Boston for the young town of Brighton. As the eastern parts of the town developed into the neighborhood of Allston, the street also served as a connection between Brighton Center and Allston. Long-time BAHS board member and webmaster **John Broderick** will delve into this history with a well-illustrated talk, that covers topics such as the cattle industry, St. Elizabeth's Hospital, the B & A rail yards, and more. **Free**
